

**ANR Pipeline Company/ANR Storage Company/  
Great Lakes Gas Transmission  
STEP 2010 Storage Expansion Project  
Non-Binding Open Season Summary**

**Introduction**

ANR Pipeline Company (“ANR”), ANR Storage Company (“ANRSCo”) and Great Lakes Gas Transmission Limited Partnership (“GLGT”) announce the commencement of a coordinated non-binding open season for up to 35 Bcf of firm storage service and associated firm storage-related transportation services utilizing new and/or existing storage and pipeline facilities of ANR, ANRSCo and/or GLGT (“the Project”). The STEP 2010 Non-Binding Open Season will commence at 2:00 PM CDT on September 20, 2007, and close at 2:00 PM CST on November 7, 2007.

**Firm Storage Service**

The Project would provide storage service for gas sourced off of the GLGT, TransCanada PipeLines Limited (“TCPL”), and ANR systems, including prospective interconnects along ANR’s Southeast Mainline (SEML) with Rockies Express (REX) at ANR/Shelbyville, and with multiple pipelines sourcing expanding Fayetteville and Barnett Shale production. The Project would be capable of delivering storage volumes to markets off of the ANR and GLGT systems as well as into TCPL for redelivery to TCPL’s Canadian Mainline markets in Ontario and the US Northeast gateways. The indicative price for the 70 day ratcheted firm storage service is \$1.50/Dth/MSQ with a minimum term of five (5) years. The targeted in-service date is April 1, 2010.

**Firm Injection/Withdrawal Transport**

The Project is intended to utilize existing or expansion capacity as necessary to provide firm injection and withdrawal transport from shipper-requested receipt and delivery points along the ANR and GLGT systems. In particular, the Project is intended to utilize firm withdrawal transport to ANR and GLGT markets and to TCPL’s Canadian Mainline markets and export points including Dawn, Niagara, Chippawa, Iroquois/Waddington and East Hereford/Pittsburg.

TCPL will soon be initiating a coordinated non-binding open season process for capacity connecting services on ANR, Great Lakes, and Canadian Mainline systems. This process will enable TCPL to assess the interest level for service to and from Michigan receipt points to Canadian markets and export points served by TCPL’s Canadian Mainline.

Together, these coordinated open seasons will enable ANR, ANRSCo, GLGT and TCPL to fully assess the interest level for storage service and for storage-related transportation service from existing and developing supply basins to its proposed Michigan storage assets and from those storage assets to the broad market base which they serve in the U.S. and Canada, and by doing so, develop a more cost effective Project.
