Prior to his current appointment in June 2006, Mr. Lohnes was President and Chief Executive Officer of Great Lakes Gas Transmission Company. Great Lakes is a pipeline joint venture owned 50/50 by TransCanada and El Paso Corporation. It is one of TransCanada's largest partially-owned pipeline investments. Mr. Lohnes became President and CEO in August 2000.

Mr. Lohnes is the former Chief Financial Officer of TC PipeLines, LP and is currently a director of TC PipeLines, GP Inc.

Mr. Lohnes joined TransCanada in 1993 and has held various executive positions in the areas of joint ventures pipelines, midstream and international. He also held management positions in Finance. Prior to joining TransCanada, Mr. Lohnes worked as a corporate and securities lawyer for a major Alberta law firm. Mr. Lohnes is a member of the Law Society of Alberta.
